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ILMEA Honors



For the sixth year, Yorkville Middle School hosted auditions for the ILMEA band, choir, orchestra, and jazz festivals. Thousands of auditions took place on October 1st, as students from across ILMEA District IX sought to be a part of this year's honor festival. Yorkville Middle School had eight students participate in the honor festival on Saturday, November 5th at Oswego East High School. Students spent the day working with guest clinicians and concluded at 3:00pm with an outstanding concert. Elizabeth Peterson, the associate conductor of bands at the University of Illinois, was the guest conductor for the band. Joanne May, the orchestra director at Elmhurst College, conducted the orchestra. Martin Sirvatka, retired choir director from Glenbrook South High School, was the guest choir conductor.

On October 4th, forty-one YHS students traveled to Addison Trail High School to audition among 2,500 students for the ILMEA District and All-State festivals. From those auditions, twelve YHS students were selected to participate in the District IX Honors Festival. Eddie Quiroga was also selected to participate in the District IX Jazz Festival.

On Saturday, November 19th the twelve YHS students traveled to Lake Park High School for a day of performing challenging music under the direction of professional and collegiate conductor/educators. The orchestra was under the direction of Dr. William Jones, (Director of Orchestral Studies - University of Iowa), the band was under the direction of Dr. Stephen Peterson, (Director of Bands – University of Illinois), and the choir was under the direction of Dr. Andrew Last, (Professor of Music, Collegiate Choral and Norsemen Conductor – Luther College).








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YORKVILLE MUSIC BOOSTERS ANNOUNCE MUSIC PATRON CAMPAIGN


