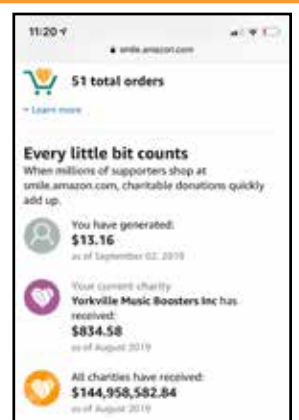

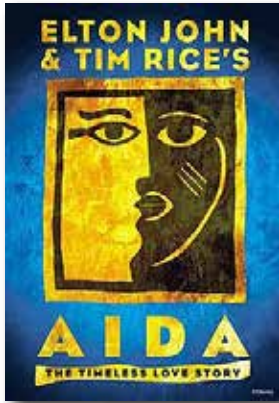

The 2020 Illinois High School Theatre Festival (IHSTF), the largest and oldest non-competitive high school theatre festival in the nation, is proud to feature Elton John and Tim Rice's *Aida* as its 2020 All-State production. *Aida* features a select ensemble of the top high school actors, technicians, and musicians from throughout the state of Illinois.

Winner of four 2000 Tony Awards, Elton John and Tim Rice's *Aida* is an epic tale of love, loyalty and betrayal, chronicling the love triangle between *Aida*, a Nubian princess stolen from her country, *Amneris*, an Egyptian princess, and *Radames*, the soldier they both love.

Rehearsals for *Aida* take place over several long weekends during the Fall of 2019, with final rehearsals occurring the last week before the actual performances. This year's performance venue is the Braden Auditorium at Illinois State University. *Aida* runs from January 9th-11th, 2020. This is a closed event for participants of the Illinois High School Theatre Festival. There are no public tickets available for these performances.

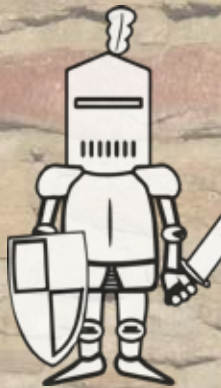


26th Annual YHS Madrigal Dinner

His vision of artistic excellence facilitated projects and collaborations with other art forms including use of electronic music, visual aids, and computer technology in an orchestral setting.

A passionate music educator, Dr. Ivanov is a sought-after clinician and adjudicator. He conducts clinics with various student ensembles and adjudicates competitions in the state of Illinois and beyond.

On October 3rd, 2019, **Mr. Chip Staley** visited YHS and worked with the Wind Symphony and Wind Ensemble. The majority of his clinic focused on rhythmic alignment of the ensembles

Mr. Charles "Chip" Staley directs the Wind Symphony at the Merit School of Music in Chicago. He teaches graduate classes at VanderCook College of Music, serves as an Education Clinician for Conn-Selmer, and is the Founder and President of ARTSpeaks, Inc. Mr. Staley is the recipient of the ASBDA Distinguished Band Director Award, the ILMEA Mary Hoffman Excellence in Teaching Award, the CYSO Music Inspiration Award, the John Philip Sosua Foundation's Sudler Flag of Honor, and the John Paynter Lifetime Achievement Award. Under Mr. Staley's leadership, Neuqua Valley High School was twice recognized by the GRAMMY Foundation as the National GRAMMY Signature School and was awarded the 2009 John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts National Schools of Distinction in Arts Education Award. Mr. Staley is a National Board Certified Teacher and holds degrees from the University of Wisconsin and the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign.
